

ABOUT THE ARTISTS

MOJU author, composer, vocals

Recent years have seen musician and songwriter Mo'Ju enter new realms of renown, their brand of visceral storytelling striking at the heart of a country whose social and cultural climate was manoeuvring a particular state of unrest and change.

A full spectrum of emotion and sonic textures marry together in Mo'Ju's music, producing sounds that can be equal measures of sensuality, vulnerability and hard-hitting strength.

The inability to categorise where an artist such as Mo'Ju fits has been a common narrative throughout their career. However, the Naarm-based musician, songwriter, storyteller and third culture kid (Filipino/Wiradjuri), is not here to be boxed in and commodified. Their music is created in alignment with a central artistic vision that is built on truth, authenticity and most importantly, legacy.

Which brings us to the present day, and the beginning of MoJu's next creative chapter.

JAMIE MESSENGER orchestral arrangements

Jamie Messenger is a composer, producer and multi-instrumentalist. At Adelaide University Jamie learnt the art of orchestration, studying under composer Graeme Koehne and achieving first class honours. His instinct for orchestral composition and skills as both arranger and performer saw him working with the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra before even completing his degree.

Jamie's skill in orchestration combined with his understanding of the popular music world led him to be a favourite choice for collaborations between bands and orchestras. He has worked closely with many of the country's most successful artists including Sia, the Teskey Brothers and The Whitlams and has composed and arranged music for every major Australian symphony orchestra.

Jamie first came across Mo'Ju's music a few years back whilst performing in a support band for one of their shows. This is their second orchestral collaboration together.

ABOUT THE ARTISTS

NICOLAS BUC conductor

Nicholas Buc is a composer, conductor, and instrumentalist. He studied composition with Brenton Broadstock and Stuart Greenbaum at the University of Melbourne, where he received the inaugural Fellowship of Australian Composers Award. As the recipient of the Brian May Scholarship for Australian film composers, he completed a Master's degree in Scoring for Film and Multimedia at New York University, studying with Ira Newborn and Paul Chihara as well as receiving the Elmer Bernstein Award for Film Scoring.

Nicholas Buc has conducted the live-in-concert world premieres of John Williams' Close Encounters of the Third Kind, Alan Menken's Beauty and the Beast and Nicholas Hooper's Harry Potter and the Half-Blood Prince. He has conducted all the major Australian symphony orchestras as well as the Minnesota Orchestra and Houston, Milwaukee, Indianapolis, Austin, Grand Rapids and Madison symphony orchestras in the US. In Asia, he has conducted the Tokyo, Hong Kong, Malaysian, Osaka and Taipei Philharmonic orchestras.

Nicholas Buc's works have been premiered by the Royal Melbourne Philharmonic Orchestra and Choir, The Australian Voices, Melbourne Chamber Orchestra, Benaud Trio and Concordis Chamber Choir. He has also worked with Tina Arena on six Australian tours and written arrangements for Missy Higgins, Passenger, Eskimo Joe and The Whitlams, as well as working on five seasons of The Voice Australia. In February/March he conducted concerts with Wynton Marsalis and the Jazz at Lincoln Center Orchestra.

Nicholas Buc is currently completing a major theatrical work, TROT. His ballet score, Kazka, for the Lehenda Ukrainian Dance Company, toured throughout Australia, Canada and the US.
